

Golden Guardian 2013 Stakeholder Objectives Meeting *Participating Organizations' Top Priority Issues and Goals*

The following list of priority issues and goals of participating organizations cited in the GG13 Exercise Series meeting on June 18 will be incorporated into the summary report. *(Those that were mentioned by more than one participant are noted with an asterisk and listed up front.)*

- Roles and responsibilities of government agencies, and private sector, and non-governmental organizations*
- Unified Command and multi-agency coordination testing*
- Major earthquake impacts/interdependencies of lifelines and other infrastructures and health and human safety, economic, environmental consequences*
- Regional plan and processes for fuel availability, allocation, and distribution (including plans for revamping CA fuel set-aside program)*
- Examination of existing and potential useful mutual aid agreements*
- Interoperable communications*
- Logistics challenges associated with providing food, water, and other life-sustaining products and services*
- Response resource tracking by State Operations Center*
- SOC/REOC relationship and utility of REOC from Sacramento location*
- Hazmat responsibilities and handling, removal, storage, disposal, and decontamination*
- Debris removal*
- Capabilities and requirements to have situational awareness/common operating picture*
- Assessment and validation of regional catastrophic disaster plans, priority-setting and decision-making process*
- County Emergency Operations Center activation procedures
- Infection control and disease containment in temporary shelters
- Disaster response communication and coordination with non-profits
- Effectiveness of county social services in disaster response
- Transportation system coordination through the REOC
- Dealing with mass fatalities
- Damage report process
- Integration of utilities and infrastructure earthquake impacts and disruption durations in the scenario
- Coordination of regional restoration and rebuilding activities
- Region-wide mass evacuations*
- Animal sheltering
- Use of smart phones and related technologies for response and recovery*
- People with emotional needs
- Sustaining EOCs over a long period of time
- Damage assessment reporting to CalEMA
- Cross-sector information sharing with focus on utilities and hospital surge capabilities*
- Critical infrastructure and essential service provider supply chains*

- Mass patient movement
- Restarting lifelines (technical challenges associated with electric power, natural gas, water and waste water, communications)
- Hospital triage procedures
- Medical assets for surges
- At-risk individuals, particular people with functional needs
- Identification of significant policy and regulatory impediments
